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Technical Committee Report

The proposed Class Rules Changes (CRC)

C.2 CREW LIMITATIONS AND

C.5.2 OPTIONAL PORTABLE EQUIPMENT

have been approved by World Sailing and valid as of March 1, 2025. Please see the updated Class Rules on the World Sailing website: Microsoft Word - J22_CR_2025-March-01

This means that the maximum combined crew weight is now raised to 290kg.

And for the electronic or mechanical devices, all types of equipment are allowed which have timing, tactical and navigational functions as long as they have internal batteries. Electronic wind instruments are still not allowed.

For the Class Rules Changes (CRC) for the C.9.7. STANDING RIGGING and corresponding F.6.1 MATERIALS, we couldn't agree with World Sailing on a practical wording for the Ultra-High-Molecular-Weight Polyethylene Robe (widely known as dyneema) for the lower backstay. Therefore this Class Rule change has been postponed until we can find a practical definition for the minimum rope diameter.

I would like to encourage you to continue giving us feedback or comments. Only by that we can develop the Class in the spirit of their sailors. I am honored to work with all members of the various Committees of our Class to make our Class even better.

The J/22 Midwinter **Championship** is coming back to Rush Creek Yacht Club in Rockwall, Texas March 14-16, 2025. RCYC last held the Midwinters in 2008 and ran the 2000 and 2009 J/22 North Americans.

You are guaranteed two things in Texas. First, there is plenty of room for parking, trailer storage, launching and dockage. Second, you will have a great time on and off the water. RCYC just held the 2024 Sunfish World Championship with 100 competitors from 14 different countries and is looking forward to again hosting the J/22 Midwinters.

Thursday, March 13th is a practice race at 3:00 pm followed by a welcome reception and competitors' briefing at 7:00. On Friday, Saturday

and Sunday, breakfast will be served + a quick competitor briefing at 8:45 with the first warning signal at 9:55. After racing Friday and Saturday, there will be a keg, snacks and sailors' debrief on the back deck. Nine races are scheduled with no race after 2:00 pm on Sunday. The dinner and party for three crew Saturday evening is also included in the entry

fee. Extra meal/social packages will be available to purchase at registration.

Weather in the middle of March can be warm in the 70s or colder in the 50-60s. The sailing area on Lake Ray Hubbard is mostly flat water unless there is a very strong northwesterly, which occurs as fronts move from Colorado to Texas. Bring your shorts, t-shirts, ballcaps, foulies, stocking caps and gloves! If you need racing equipment or sailing gear for the regatta, sponsor Vela Sailing Supply is located within 15 minutes of RCYC for shopping and/or delivery to the event.

J/22 Winning Techniques and Strategies

Seminar Overview

Purpose: Provide directed learning to help your team improve your J/22 racing experience.

Components of the course:

- Classroom Discussion in the Doolin Center at Rush Creek Yacht Club, Heath, Texas
- On-the-Water Instruction with dedicated coaching during the Independence Day Regatta (March 1-2, 2025) at Rush Creek Yacht Club.
- Post-race analysis
- Technical demonstrations, (rigging, boat handling, compass use, crew technique, etc.)

Goals:

- Improve upwind and downwind speed. Competitive upwind and downwind speed is essential for learning from racing experiences.
- Understanding J/22 Rig Tune. Understand the effect on the rig when you adjust the rig, use the mainsheet and backstay.
- **Using a Compass**. Effectively using a compass enhances your tactical ability.
- **Crew Technique**. Tips and techniques for improving for team's crew work and talking through what happens when bad things happen.
